



## **Taxonomy:** Propaganda





   Methods and Values


## So Who is a Journalist?

# What Makes News Different? Verification Process that establishes or confirms the accuracy or truth of something





The bureau's findings are based on interviews with witnesses to strikes in Pakistan's rugged tribal area, where reporting is often dangerous and difficult. American officials have questioned the accuracy of such claims, asserting that accounts might be concocted by militants or falsely confirmed by residents who fear retaliation.

## What Makes News Different? Independence

Freedom from the control, influence, or support of interested parties, coupled with a conscious effort to set aside any preexisting beliefs and a system of checks and balances.




