

Society of Professional Journalists

Code of Ethics: (excerpts)

✓ Distinguish between advocacy and news reporting.

✓ Analysis and commentary should be labeled and not misrepresent fact or context.

 \checkmark Deny favored treatment to advertisers and special interests and resist their pressure to influence news coverage.

 \checkmark Remain free of associations and activities that may compromise integrity or damage credibility.





News Report or Opinion Journalism?





Surgeon General's Warning: A News Report will often include the opinions of experts, participants or witnesses. That is <u>not</u> what is meant by "Opinion Journalism." Failure to cling to this distinction may be harmful or fatal to your grade.

Definition of News

Main Entry: **news** ()) Pronunciation: \'nüz, 'nyüz\ Function: noun plural but singular in construction Usage: often attributive Date: 15th century

News is information about a subject of some public interest that is shared and subject to the journalistic process of verification by an independent organization that is accountable.

Definition of Opinion

Main Entry: opin-ion **4**) Pronunciation: 'a-'pin-yon' Function: noun Etymology: Middle English, from Anglo-French, from Latin opinion-, opinio, from opinion' Date: 14th century

Opinion Journalism Landmarks: Exaggeration or Superlatives


