January 28-29, 1954, to December 15-16, 1955

- A temporary committee is appointed to review the “establishment of a teachers college on Long Island.” It recognizes the phenomenal growth in population and the greatly increased school enrollment on Long Island. It was voted and approved “that the Chancellor be authorized to appoint a temporary committee of three Regents (Moot, Brosnan and Wickersham) to confer with the State University on the matter of establishing a teachers college on Long Island and to make recommendations to the Board.

- It is noted that this issue in meeting the “needs of Long Island in the fields of teacher training and college education have been under study jointly by the staffs of the Department of Education and of the State University for many months.” As a result there appears in the State Legislative Assembly a resolution (#73) concurred in without amendment by the Senate the following: “*Resolved*, That the State Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York direct the State University Trustees to formulate plans immediately and make recommendations for the organization, development, coordination and expansion of the State University by the creation of a new State Teachers College on Long Island.” It also notes that the Trustees proceed to formulate plans and make recommendations to the Board of Regents “for the organization, development, coordination and expansion of the State University by the creation of a new State Teachers College on Long Island, and to continue the studies now underway covering the needs of Long Island in the fields of teacher training and also education at the college level, and to submit such plans and report to the Board of Regents no later than January 1, 1956.
