

Anonymity in Police Shooting Fuels Anger in Missouri

FERGUSON, Mo. — In the five days since an unarmed young black man was fatally shot by a police officer here, the selective release of information about the shooting, and especially the anonymity granted to the officer, has stoked frustrations in this largely African-American community north of St. Louis, where residents describe increasingly tense relations with the police.

Staten Island Man Died From Chokehold During Arrest, Autopsy Finds

The New York City medical examiner announced on Friday that a Staten Island man died from a chokehold and the compression of his chest by police officers as they <u>arrested him last month</u> for allegedly peddling untaxed cigarettes.

An autopsy found that the manner of death for Eric Garner, 43, was homicide, the medical examiner said in a statement. While the report found that Mr. Garner's poor health was a contributing factor, it was not the primary cause of his death.

The statement did not include details about any injuries to Mr. Garner's body discovered during the autopsy. And it did not provide any information about how the medical examiner's office reached its conclusions.
