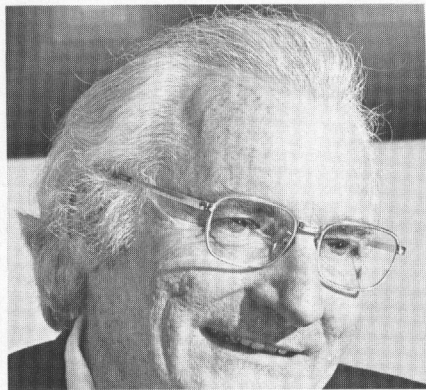


ONE MAN LEFT DR. JOHN S. TOLL

AND ANOTHER RETURNED DR. CARL J. RHEINS

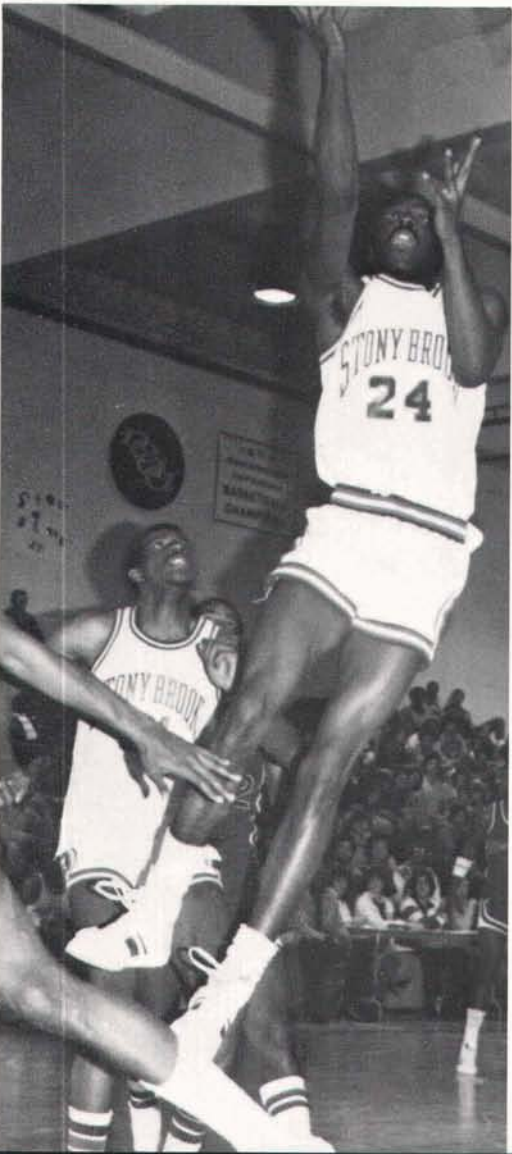
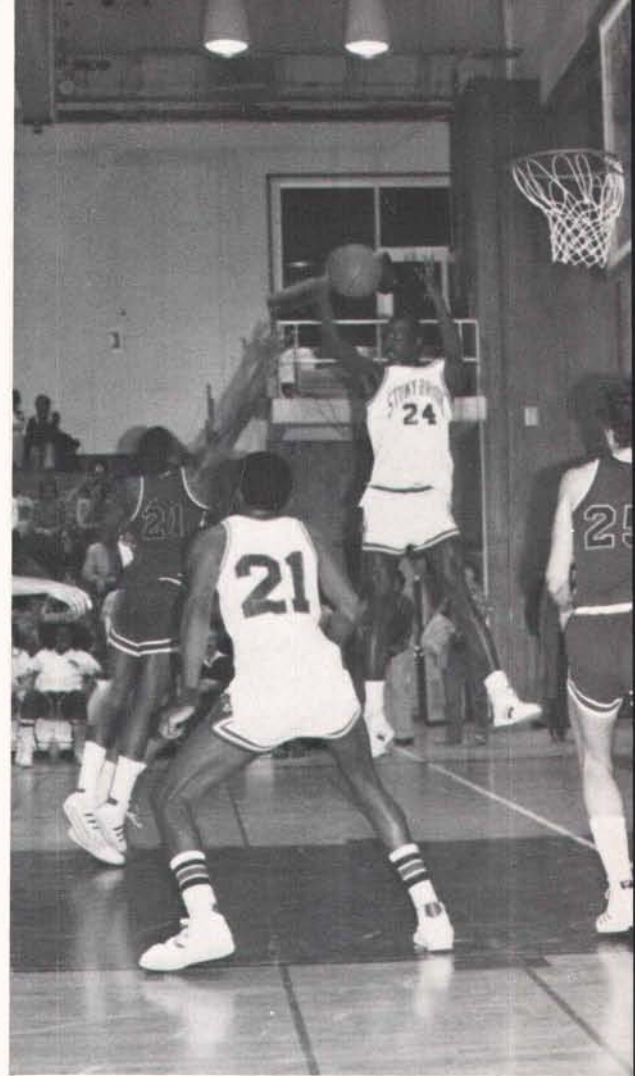

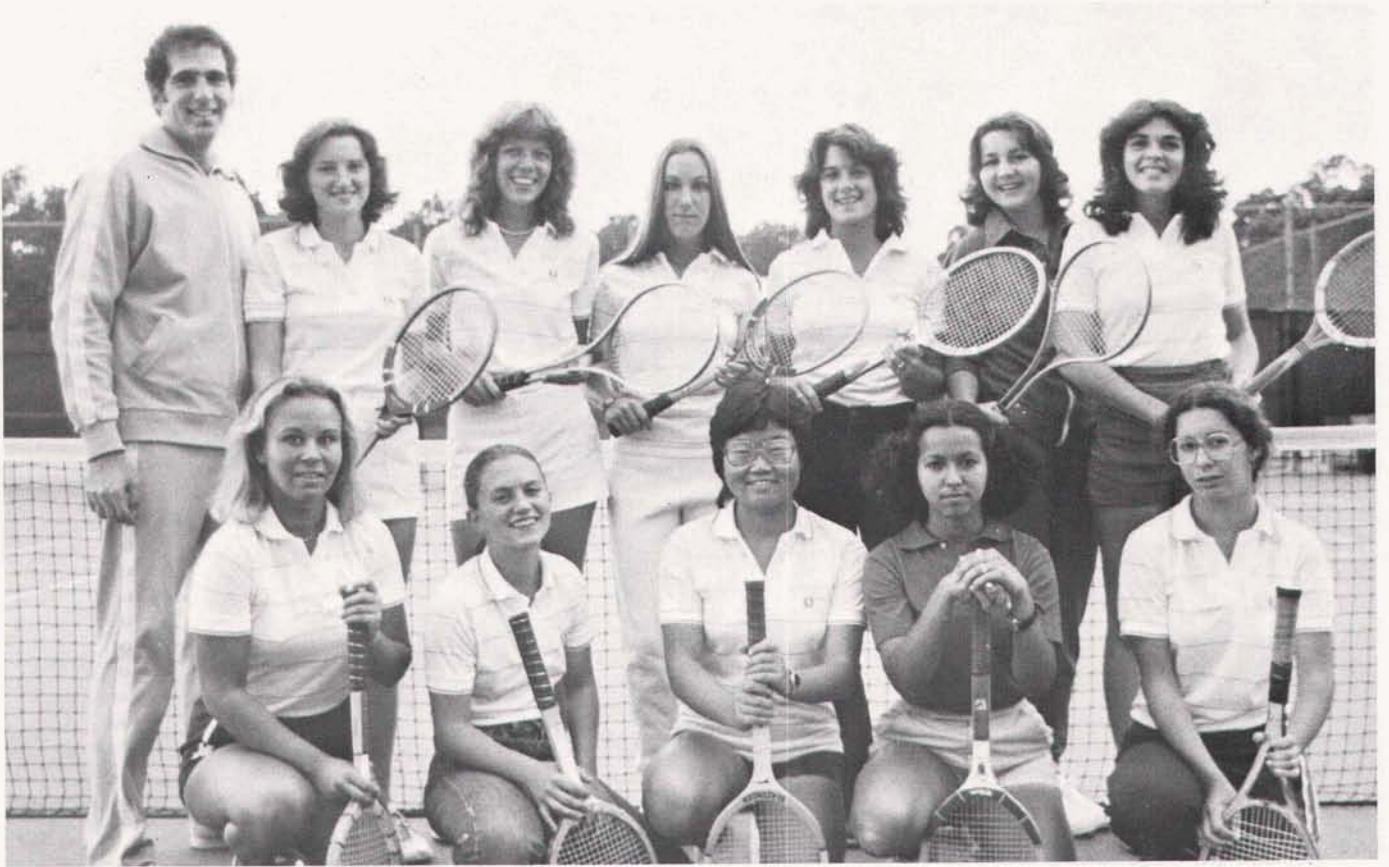
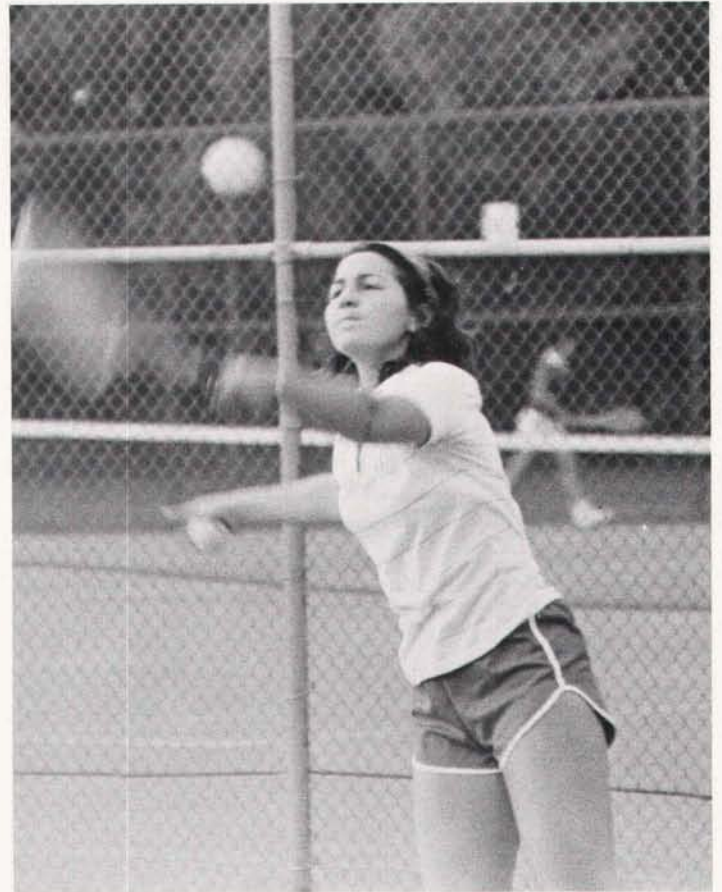


MEN'S TENNIS

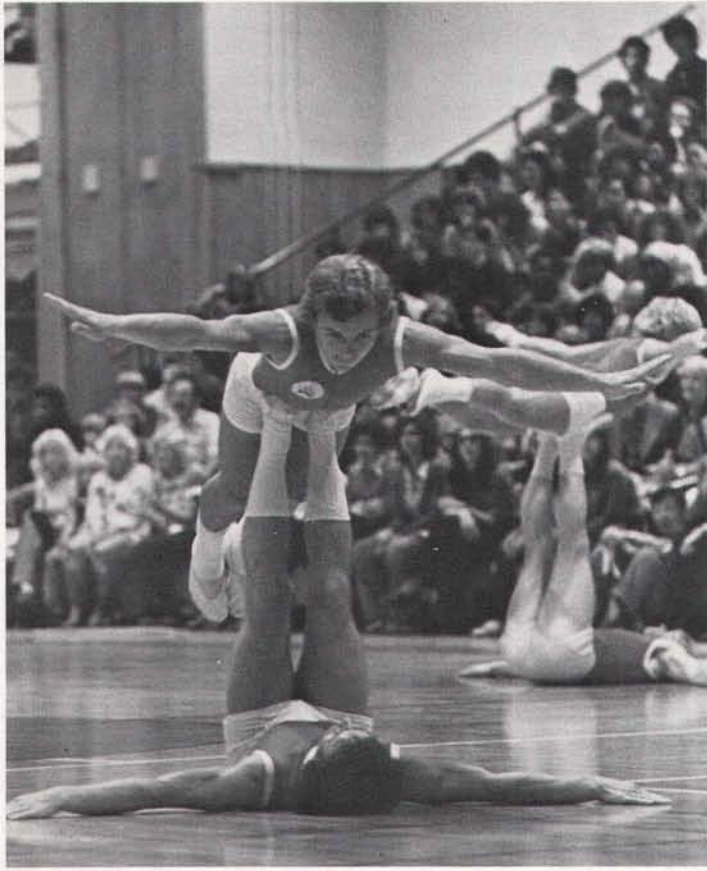


WES HOUSTON


Dave Greenberg and Bob Biello, our senior portrait photographers, are owed a debt of thanks for their time and truly professional senior portraits!
