THEME UP AND OUT

Welcome to "Here at Stony Brook." I'm Al Oickle, your host for this weekly half-hour program about the State University of New York at Stony Brook.

We have two guests today. Professor Michael Hurd, who is <sup>A Faculty member in</sup> the Department of Economics, here at Stony Brook, has been studying Social Security, that national supplementary income program for the elderly that some say is in danger of going broke. He and his colleagues have developed some research that proves <sup>challenges and</sup> wrong several popular misconceptions about the elderly's income. And Professor Hurd has a solution to this immense problem. We'll talk with him about ~~his~~ his Social Security research in a moment.

Later, we will discuss a strange, newly discovered disease, called Lyme Disease, with Professor Barbara Charles of the School of Nursing, here at Stony Brook.

Professor Hurd, you have been researching the income of the elderly, with special attention to Social Security income. You suggest, as I understand it, that the federal government ought to make a stronger <sup>TD</sup> distinction between the "elderly rich" and the "elderly poor." Will you explain this, please?
