Lazar Gosman has spent his entire and life in music.

He is a noted violinist and conductor. He is also something of an entrepeneur, having founded the Leningrad Chamber Orchestra, the Chamber Kammergild Chamber Symphony in St. Louis, the Soviet Emigre Orchestra in the United States and the Ticonderoga Music Festival in New York.

Professor Gosman will introduce himself to the campus community next Monday, Nov. 15, and then will conduct the Soviet Emigre Orchestra at Carnegie Hall on Nov. 23. This, then, is a busy time for Professor Gosman. But, he took time out recently and sat with me to talk about his experiences in the Soviet Union and the United States.
