Alfred Wagenknecht

Active in the labor movement since 1892. Delegate to the Cleveland Central Board Council in 1899 from the AFL food workers union at the age of 18.

Went to Washington at age 19 in 1900. Worked in logging camps. Became state organizer of the Socialist Party at age of 20. Became acquainted with Wm. Z. Foster in Seattle in 1905 during the free speech fights. Was elected a member of the national executive committee of the Socialist Party.

Returned to Ohio in 1913. Joined Chas. Ruthenberg in the leadership of the Socialist Party and was elected state secretary of Ohio. Jailed for opposing World War I. Participated in the left wing grouping of the S.P. against its reformist a pro-Imperialist leadership.

One of the founders of the Communist Parties in 1919. Missouri District organizer in Ohio, Connecticut and the anthracite. Helped in the Pennsylvania-Ohio miners' strike in 1928 also in the Kentucky miners' strike and the Passaic and Gastonia textile strikes.

In Chicago for the last ten years and presently member of the state committee and state organizer of the Communist Party of Illinois.
