Hi, everybody. What day is today? Monday? Sunday? Does it make a difference what day it is? Well, I hope you know what day it is. And does it make a difference? You bet. Just ask Eviat Zerubavel. Dr. Zerubavel is a professor sociology at the State University of New York at Stony Brook, and his new book, called "The Seven Day Circle," answers every question you may have ever had about days of the week. Indeed, I found the book fascinating, couldn't put it down, read it in one sitting and found answers to hundreds of questions that had never occurred to me.

Dr. Zerubavel, your research pretty much makes clear that there is nothing especially magic about our having seven days in a week, rather than eight, or 10 , or five. INTERVIEW DR. ZERUBAVEL:
