2009 CAMPUS STATEMENT

Empire State College was founded in 1971, the creation of Chancellor Earnest Boyer and Governor Nelson Rockefeller for the purpose of expanding access to higher education for non-traditional students through innovative means. The College offers both undergraduate and graduate programs at seven regional centers and 28 satellite units throughout New York State, as well as on-line courses through the Center for Distance Learning (CDL), and international programs in which the College partners with host institutions abroad. The College's administrative offices, referred to as the Coordinating Center, are located in Saratoga Springs. As of Fall 2008, the College employed 631 full and 1276 part-time faculty and staff statewide. Current enrollment at the College with comparative data from 2000-01 are highlighted in the following table:

Since its founding in 1971, Empire State College has developed an alumni base of 60,000.

Twenty-three of the College's locations are in commercially leased space of nearly 250,000 square feet at an annual cost of approximately \$4.6 million. There is approximately 12,000 square feet provided to the College rent-free in state-owned facilities. The College occupies five main buildings in Saratoga Springs; two of these buildings are owned by the Empire State College Foundation, and comprise a total of 70,000 square feet of space. Current capital planning efforts are focusing on two distinct areas of facility needs to support ongoing Empire State College operations, including projects for the CDL and Empire College Regional Centers.

All Union Avenue projects have been completed recently, with 28 Union Avenue, a historic Victorian structure, renovated and occupied in February 2007 and 2 Union Avenue, a new 51,000 square foot building, occupied in December 2007. Major rehabilitation work on 1 Union Avenue was completed in February 2009. The construction of a new 46,000 gross square foot building for the CDL, which began in early 2008 at the West Avenue site, is estimated for completion in Fall 2009.

In order to address the previously mentioned \$4.6 million in annual costs for leased space throughout the State, and to balance affordability concerns with the need for additional facility development over time, plans are underway to gradually phase-in a conversion from rented space to owned space. To this end, a building master plan has been developed to describe accurately the needs of future Regional Centers in new space owned by the College. The first Centers converted from leased space are planned for the Rochester and Long Island areas, to be located on the campuses of Monroe Community College and Suffolk County Community College. The estimated total costs of these new facilities are \$12.0 and \$15.6 million dollars, respectively. Both buildings are envisioned to be approximately 30,000 gross square feet. Preparations have also begun for a facilities master plan, scheduled to begin in 2010, which will support the College's mission and guide overall capital priorities for the next ten years.


