2009 CAMPUS STATEMENT

The State University of New York College at Plattsburgh was founded in 1889 as an institution of higher education with the sole mission of training teachers. It became an original member of the State University of New York system when SUNY was created in 1948.

Today, SUNY Plattsburgh is a four-year, comprehensive college that offers more than 60 baccalaureate degrees, complemented by a wide variety of minors and study options. The College also offers graduate programs in education, counselor education, leadership, speech-language pathology, natural science and school psychology, as well as nine combined bachelors/masters degrees in teacher education. With 5,736 undergraduate and 600 graduate students and a student-faculty ratio of 17 to 1, our major programs are divided among academic units grouped in the arts and sciences; business and economics; and education, health and human services. In the Fall 2009, approximately 88 percent of individuals in the incoming undergraduate class were in-state students and 12 percent were from out of state. (This out-of-state number includes international students from 51 countries and domestic U.S. students from 27 states.)

Situated in the City of Plattsburgh, the College is nestled between the Adirondack Mountains and the western shore of Lake Champlain in the northeast corner of upstate New York. The campus consists of 37 buildings spread across 261 acres and bordered by city neighborhoods and the Saranac River. Faculty, staff, students, and alumni have access to the Twin Valley Outdoor Education Center, located 40 miles south of Plattsburgh, and the Valcour Educational Conference Center, nine miles south of the city; both are owned and operated by College Auxiliary Services. In addition, SUNY Plattsburgh operates a Branch Campus located in Queensbury, NY at Adirondack Community College. The SUNY Plattsburgh Branch Campus serves about 350 full-and part-time students in undergraduate and graduate degree programs, as well as a certificate of advanced studies program. In addition, registered nurses who hold an associate degree or a hospital diploma can earn a bachelor's degree in nursing from Plattsburgh online.

The SUNY Plattsburgh campus infrastructure, facilities and grounds provide an impressive setting for a complete college education. For example, the Benjamin F. Feinberg Library, named in memory of the Plattsburgh native and New York State Senator who sponsored the legislation creating SUNY, houses more than 366,000 volumes and subscribes to over 4,000 periodicals and newspapers, both in print and online. The library's Reference and Electronic Search Services Center provides a full range of information and resources including web resources, full-text journals, and online proprietary databases, as well as, traditional print materials. Research assistance is available to all students and faculty in-person, on the phone, via email, and through a chat function.

SUNY Plattsburgh provides state-of-the-art computer facilities on campus and broad-based computer and information services for all students. The campus network links all residence halls and academic and administrative buildings. Through wireless zones, computer labs, and computer kiosks located throughout campus, students have universal access, both on and off campus, to computing resources. In addition, students, alumni and the general public can gain access to the most up-to-date information on the college through the college's Facebook fan page, as well as Twitter, YouTube and the college's own Web site.

Capital improvements to campus buildings and infrastructure continue in an informed and coordinated manner. Recent upgrades include replacing cooling towers and chillers on multiple academic buildings and adding a new elevator and entry to Saranac Hall where the College Bookstore is located. In addition, elevators are being installed to enhance ADA access in Memorial Hall and the Field House; the Sundowner dining facility is undergoing renovation; Champlain Valley Hall is getting new windows; and a new ventilation system for the Myers Fine Arts Building is under design, as are new HVAC systems for the Field House.

A new "green" integrated science building is under construction, and the renovation of the Hudson Hall science building is under design. A new building that will house programs for the School of Business and the Department of Computer Science is under program and design. The College has just completed a Residence Hall Master Plan and has kicked off a full-campus Facilities Master Plan in July, which is expected to be finished in September 2010.


