"Souls of My Sisters: Black Women Break Their Silence, Tell Their Stories and Heal Their Spirits" (with foreword by Ilyasah Shabazz) details how African American women do some serious soul-searching. Black women from all walks of life candidly reveal how they overcome challenges. From Patti LaBelle, Terrie Williams and Roslyn McMillan to single moms and spiritual leaders, these diverse females have bonded together in print, for the first time, to discuss the issues that have touched their lives.

"Souls of My Brothers" (with foreword by Isaac Hayes) features powerful first-person narratives from husbands, educators, bus drivers, teachers, fathers, politicians, and every day heroes. With raw honesty, the contributors share experiences only their brothers can truly understand the unique journey of the Black man as he struggles to define himself in society and in the world.
