SUNY recently revised their relocation policy. State employees may now be reimbursed for actual moving household goods, personal effects and travel expenses that exceed the previous limit of \$3000. The appointee should select a carrier that is registered with the Interstate Commerce Commission. If a private mover is used, three written estimates must be obtained; the lowest of which will be used for reimbursement
