### **1. August 17, 1 p.m. "Preventing Surgical Site Infections" in the OVP conference room, HSC L4 (1 CEU)**

Postoperative infection is a major cause of patient injury, mortality and health care cost. An estimated 2.6 percent of nearly 30 million operations are complicated by surgical site infections (SSIs) each year. Infection rates, up to 11 percent, are reported for certain types of operations. A recent Compendium of Strategies to Prevent Healthcare-Associated Infections in Acute Care Hospitals was published by SHEA-IDS and emphasizes the importance of reducing these infections and includes a guideline of practice recommendations to address them. Join Dr Tom Talbot as he outlines the prevention strategies you should have in place to ensure the highest level of patient safety and quality care in your organization.

### **1. Foundations of Accounting Methods**

NCE 500 \* 6 sessions \* \$595

This introduction to accounting demonstrates basic accounting fundamentals. Students will explore the recording, summarization and adjusting of financial transactions and the understanding of the basic accounting cycle. Accounting principles and concepts, preparation of budgets and variance analysis will be demonstrated. Hands-on problem sets will be used to reinforce concepts relating to financial statements. At the completion of this course, students should have an understanding of advanced accounting concepts and how they apply to current business situations.
