2. Innovative Technology Development (ITD) Program Applications Due Feb 1, 2008

The Center for Biotechnology's (CfB) ITD Program is designed to help bridge the gap between early-stage technology discovery of the academic community and commercial development interests of the bioscience industry. Multi-year awards (up to 3 years) are now available but will be subject to performance based annual renewal and availability of funds. The CfB provides up to \$50K, match-funded with a minimum \$50K from NYS company partners (years 1 and 2) for a total project award of \$100K/year. A third year of funding requires a minimum \$2:\$1 match. Larger awards are now considered but must be discussed prior to application and are subject to discretion of the ITD Advisory Board.
