It is with regret that I write to inform you that Lance King has resigned from his position as Vice President for University Advancement and President of the Stony Brook Foundation to accept a new opportunity as Executive Vice President and Managing Director with Grenzebach Glier and Associates (GG A), an international consulting firm based in Chicago. His resignation takes effect September 11, 2009.

Lance joined Stony Brook University in June 2006, energizing the University's historical seven-year Capital Campaign, The Emergence of Stony Brook, which raised more than \$362 million, surpassing its original goal of \$300 million. During Lance's brief tenure he revitalized the department and put into place an outstanding and dedicated staff of Advancement professionals.

I have asked Eric Doepel, the current Senior Associate Vice President for University Advancement, to assume interim duties and leadership of the Advancement Office, which is responsible for the development and implementation of strategies for private and public support of the University, including the Medical Center, Health Sciences Center and the Long Island State Veteran's Home.
