Mark Mitton is a professional magician who is fascinated by using magic to better understand how we see the world. In addition to creating magic for film, television, the Broadway stage, and Cirque du Soleil, Mitton tirelessly explores the theme of perception from an interdisciplinary standpoint.

He has presented 'Perception' at the Association for the Scientific Study of Consciousness conference in Berlin, at Columbia University, New York University, Middlebury College, and Brooklyn College, and has lectured with Nobel laureate Dr. Gerald Edelman of the Neurosciences Institute. Mitton frequently moderates panel discussions on topics such as 'The five Senses' and 'Deception' at the Philoctetes Center.
