I would like to personally thank the members of our Stony Brook community who have so generously donated to the Stony Brook Cares (SEFA/United Way) campaign. Even though we are facing difficult economic times, let us think of those less fortunate and how they will manage to survive without our help. With your support, affiliated agencies feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, nurture the sick, care for the elderly, counsel troubled youth, protect the environment and make an overall difference in so many lives. With over 500 charitable organizations to choose from, you are sure to find a cause that touches your heart.

Below are examples of how your contributions can make a difference in the lives of those in need.

An annual pledge of \$2.00 per pay period can provide immunization shots to 400 children in developing nations against six deadly childhood diseases.

An annual pledge of \$3.00 per pay period can provide five families with emergency food and clothing.

An annual pledge of \$4.00 per pay period can protect three square miles of coral reef - home to hundreds of species of marine plants and animals.

An annual pledge of \$5.00 per pay period can provide ten hours of home care for a senior citizen or medicine to treat 30 people with River Blindness.

Please note that even if you have contributed in past years, you must submit a new pledge form to renew your donation every year. Donations will be accepted through the middle of February 2010.
