The Provost's Lecture Series is pleased to host a talk by Bernhard Waldenfels

A professor of philosophy at Ruhr University in Bochum, Germany, since 1976, Waldenfels has written books about phenomenology, dialog theory, and structures of behavior. He is co-founder of the German Society for Phenomenological Research, which he served as Vice President from 1970 to 1976 and President from 1994 to 1996. He was a member of the scientific board of the College International at Paris from 1990 to 1998 and has been on the advisory board of the Institute for Genocide Studies at the University of Bochum since 1994.

A Ph.D. graduate from the University of Munich, he has taught throughout the world as a Visiting Professor, including Stony Brook University in 1999.

Dr. Waldenfels will present his lecture entitled "Response and Trust: Some Aspects of Responsive Ethics" on Thursday, October 28, from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM in Harriman Hall, Room 214.
