From Linda Hamilton, NP: Starting in April (through October), ticks with Lyme disease will be in their most common feeding season. To avoid getting bitten, make sure you wear bug repellents that contain "DEET" as well as light colored clothing. Ticks cannot fly, jump, or drop from trees so stay in the center of woodland paths. Check yourself often while outside and again when you get home. If you find a tick attached, use tweezers to grasp the tick's mouth as close to the skin as possible, and then pull steadily and firmly until it lets go. Wash the area and apply antiseptic. Save the tick in a container of alcohol, to show your provider. Early symptoms of Lyme disease may occur within a month of infection, often as a large circular rash with a clear center. Other early symptoms include fever, lack of energy, muscle aches, headaches, stiff neck and fatigue. Lyme disease is treatable with antibiotics. The earlier treatment begins, the easier it is to prevent long-term problems. For concerns, contact Student Health Services at x2-5014.
