



Yolanda Kakabadse, incoming president of WWF International, addressed an audience of approximately 70 people in Duke Lecture Hall on Friday. She talked about a unique program that she helped create in her home country of Ecuador where the country agrees not to dig for oil in the Yasuni National Forest in return for environmental credits. Nations and even, soon, individuals can buy *Certificados de Garantia Yasuni*, protecting millions of acres -- more species live in one hectare in Yasuni than in all of North America -- and keeping 850 million barrels of oil underground. The idea took some time to grow, but has been a terrific success. "You don't change the world by following protocols. You change the world through crazy ideas and hope they work," Kakabadse said. "I will ask Dr. Mary Pearl to invite me back, and I will have certificates to sell to you for \$25-35. ... We have to invest in recreating the world; to go against the rules, to break out of the box, and come up with solutions to save our world." Pictured with Dr. Pearl (r.) and Prof. Nay Htun.
