Off-Campus: Supernovae & the Expansion of the Universe: On October 17 th at 7:30 p.m., Prof. Allan Rice will discuss some of the most luminous, powerful and energetic events in the universe: supernovae. A supernova is the end-state for stars much more massive than the sun or exotic, white-dwarf binary star systems whose brightness and luminosity are well established. By observing a supernova in a distant galaxy, we can determine the distance to that galaxy and thus further refine our models of the universe, how it is evolving, changing and expanding. 
