- “Prehistoric Resource Exploitation on the South Coast of Cuba: Notes from the Las Obas Site,” 7 p.m., Duke Lecture Hall. Meet Prof. Elizabeth Newman, Stony Brook Southampton’s own anthropologist, who will discuss some of her recent research as part of the Student Program Board’s series of lectures. This lecture explores patterns of resource use by peoples living on the South Coast of Cuba between 350 and 500 AD. It provides an introduction to the general ecological and cultural context of the island of Cuba, defines subsistence patterns seen in the vertebrate faunal remains, and discusses the implications this analysis has for conservation strategies applied to the *Capromyidae* (the family of largely endangered West Indian Hutias). (2 pts.)
