It was a busy weekend at Stony Brook Southampton, starting with Friday night's well-attended and significant lecture on a crisis in our oceans:

Over 90 people attended "Conservation of Endangered Marine Fishes in the World's Oceans" in Duke Lecture Hall on October 3, with **Dr. Ellen K. Pikitch**, Professor and Executive Director of Stony Brook University's Institute for Ocean Conservation Science. She spoke on the massive depletion of marine life in the world's oceans over the past 100 years due to man's fishing and negative influence on underwater habitats. The event was sponsored by The School of Marine and Atmospheric Sciences and Stony Brook Southampton. Look for a story about it in Dan's Papers this Friday.

A touching tribute to the late **Harry Marmion**, former President of Southampton College of LIU, was held in the Avram Theater on Saturday and numerous speakers included officials from Stony Brook University (President **Shirley Strum Kenny**), government (Congressman **Tim Bishop** and former New York City Mayor **David Dinkins**), the United States Tennis Association (including current President **Jane Brown Grimes**) and faculty and administration from the former Southampton College (former Chancellor **Robert FX Sillerman**, former Dean **Charles Hitchcock** and LIU professors **John Strong** and **Donald Baker**), along with Marmion's family and friends. Dr. Marmion was not only Southampton College's leader during its early years, but also was USTA President, spearheading the effort for the creation and naming of Arthur Ashe Stadium. About 350 people attended Saturday's event.

Also on Saturday was the culmination of **Family Weekend**, which, **Diane Redo**, Coordinator of Campus Recreation and Student Activities, reports: "I would say that we had 200 people during the course of a three hour span; we had recycled jewelry and records, the Town of Southampton came to support our events and the live music was soothing to the soul."
