“HAZE,” a full-length documentary film examining the drinking culture in America, made its World Premiere at the 2008 Hamptons Film Festival and will debut here in Duke Lecture Hall on Wednesday, February 18, at 7 p.m. Directed by Pete Schuermann, **“HAZE” sheds light on the severity of college binge drinking through compelling images filmed at campus parties**, during emergency medical calls and from police files, including details on the circumstances surrounding the 2004 alcohol poisoning death of college freshmen Gordie Bailey, whose friends thought he was “sleeping it off.” Each year, alcohol misuse claims the lives of more than 1,700
