NAACP HEAD PRAISES POND



On April 19, over 175 students demonstrated in the Fine Arts Plaza outside of the meeting of the State University of New York trustees, urging them not to name T.A. Pond president of Stony Brook.

At the meeting Kenneth Anderson, President of the Brookhaven Branch of the NAACP criticized the affirmative action programs here and the failure of contractors to hire Blacks for campus construction. He also said that Stony Brook's affirmative action program was "second to none" in the state system. He called Pond the principle architect and supportive of every affirmative action on campus. He further stated, "We hold him in high regard."

The trustees are expected to announce their decision on Pond's appointment sometime next week.

EDITORIAL COMMENT: We question the statement by Mr. Anderson and wonder what he means by "we." We welcome his explanations.
