## WINTER DA MEETS

Thirty UUP Chapters sent a total of 149 egates to the Winter Delegate
Assembly which was held at the Americana Inn in Albany the weekend of February 2-3. After registration and a buffet dinner the meeting convened on Friday evening recessing at 11PM and continuing throughout Saturday morning.

Financial matters were of great concern to the delegates. The treasurer's and Finance Committee's reports stired debate and comment. Questions were raised not only on current budgetary items but also on their future fiscal impact. The PACE program (UUP's "Project for Adult Continuing Education") which is budgeted for \$25,000 this year was passed with the stipulation that the Executive Board approve any proposed plans and present a progress report at the next Delegate Assembly. The Finance Committee was directed to tabulate avartable data and make a recommendation to the Executive Board on the impact of a dues reduction to.9% (without maxima) of gross salary.

ing with fiscal matters included a motion to obtain FTE release time for each chapter porportional to its membership because of the time demands placed on union officers. Both this motion and substitute motion recommending stipends

for chapter presidents, Executive Board members and others were defeated. A motion for the Executive Board to study the political and economic impact of FTE release time for the chapters and to report back to the campuses prior to the May DA was passed.

A Constitutional amendment proposed by the Cortland Chapter concerning the composition of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee was referred to the Constitutional Committee. A motion that UUP continue to get total membership opinion respecting priorities for negotiations was passed.

Delegates voted to investigate the advisability for an advertising campaign to promote SUNY and to attract students to our campuses. They also passed motions to support retraining of retrenched UUP members and to continue support for Farmingdale's class action suit for parity in salaries among SUNY units. Several agenda items were either withdrawn or tabled for action at a later assembly.
