

It is that time once again. Let your voice be heard by exercising your right to vote in the upcoming UUP Chapter Elections. This Special Edition Bridges Election Issue will spotlight the 2009 Stony Brook/HSC nominees for various UUP offices. This year, UUP President Kathy Southerton who has held office for two years will be seeking re-election. In addition, the UUP membership will vote to select a Vice President for Academics, a Vice President for Professionals, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Part-Time Concerns Representative and choose both Academic and Professional delegates to represent the chapter at Delegate Assemblies.
