Stony Brook HSC Wins VOTE/COPE Award Chapter & UUP Set New Contribution Records

For the first time, the Stony Brook Health Sciences Center Chapter of UUP has won the NYSUT Abel Blattman Award for our per capita contribution rate to the union's nonpartisan political action fund. Our chapter has been recognized at the 2004 NYSUT Convention in late March. Our statewide union, UUP, has seen a total increase of 8% by members from all chapters to the highest level amount ever contributed by UUP members.

Chapter President **Ed Drummond** reflected, "This shows that UUP members, here at the hospital and across the state are getting the message that decisions will be made about our jobs, our facilities, and patients whether we participate or not. Regardless of our feelings about politics, these decisions are made in the political arena. Having a political voice takes money. Stony Brook HSC UUPers are stepping up to the plate. I think that this is wonderful."

The Stony Brook HSC contributes the largest dollar amount of any of UUP's chapters. In the past four years, the number of our chapter's members contributing to the fund has more than doubled, adding over two hundred new contributors just last year. With the recent increase in our chapter's participation, we have one of the highest percentage of members contributing to the fund from any of UUP's chapters.

Kathy Southerton and Doris R. Weisman are co-chairs of Stony Brook's VOTE/COPE campaign. Kathy also serves as vice-chair of UUP's statewide legislative committee. She reviewed the results and added, "We are seeing a change in the culture of UUPers here and across the state. Members are realizing that they can make a difference and make things better and that VOTE/COPE is an important tool to making that progress." She further urged members who wish to start contributing or to increase their contributions to contact the UUP office.

Ed Drummond added, "I am proud of our membership and want to thank everyone who contributes to VOTE/COPE. Now let's make next year's number even better!!!"



Are women getting paid as equally as men at Stony Brook?

Stony Brook HSC UUP Chapter to form "Gender Equity Committee" By Kim Rhatigan-Drexler, co-editor, *Bridges*

John Marino, Statewide V.P. for Professionals and the Statewide Officer in charge of the Gender Equity Study, visited Stony Brook on March 3, 2004 with Vicky Janik, from the UUP Women's Rights and Concerns Committee and Tom Kriger, Director of Research for UUP to discuss the UUP Gender Equity Project. In 2002, UUP hired a nationally-recognized expert in the field of gender equity, Professor Mary Gray, Chair of the Mathematics and Statistics Department at American University, to conduct an analysis of the UUP bargaining unit. When she recently presented her preliminary findings, Professor Gray made the following recommendations:

- 1. For academic faculty: Efforts should be made on individual campuses to gather more information in order to refine the salary models used- for example, where it is asserted that certain disciplines require a market premium, additional information on experience, any productivity measures (degree, publications, etc) that may be available.
- 2. For professional faculty: Better characteristics of jobs are required. In addition, information on education, experience, and productivity should be sought.
- **J. Marino** stated that UUP needs better data from the individual chapters. **V. Janik** commented that in the past, UUP has gotten money for protective classes in the early 1990's and salary adjustments were made for local inequities. The time is now to revisit the gender equity issue to determine if there is data to support the perception of gender inequity.

What's the next step?

Representatives from the UUP officers and Women's Rights and Concerns Committee are now engaged in an effort to recruit and mobilize a group of committed UUP members at each chapter to collect the necessary data. The UUP Research Department has been instructed to provide any and all assistance to the chapters as they compile this data.

John Marino requested that members of our chapters form a subgroup to discuss how data can be collected from individual departments at Stony Brook HSC. Different data elements could include tenure status, discretionary monies, number of years of service and child rearing leave. He stated that UUP is committed to making sure the Gender Equity Project is completed to its members' satisfaction.

Labor movement marks Workers Memorial Day

Unionists across the nation will pause Wednesday, April 28, to remember workers who were killed or injured on the job. Workers Memorial Day will also mark labor's efforts to renew the fight for strong safety and health protections.

Sponsored by the AFL-CIO, the theme of this year's Workers Memorial Day is "Good Jobs. Safe Jobs. Protect Workers Now." "Our fight for safer workplaces has become harder as the Bush administration has joined with business supporters to roll back, block or stall needed worker protections," said AFL-CIO President John Sweeney. "The fight for good jobs is on, too, as corporations look to export jobs and cut pay and benefits, encouraged by an administration that thinks outsourcing jobs is a good thing." Why Donate Again?

- The metropolitan area, including Long Island, has experienced a 25% loss of its blood supply because European blood is no longer available (theoretical risk of mad cow disease)
- · This loss needs to be made up by new donors
- · FDA increase in donor restrictions
- · Need for current donors to give on an ongoing basis
- · Blood and platelet shortages occur regularly during the summer months
- · Misperceptions as to the need and use of blood in America

Who Can Donate Blood? You, Family & Friends...

- · Anyone who is 17 years of age through 75 years of age
- The donor needs to weigh at least 110 lb.
- · General Good Health

Blood Donation Process

- · Completion of Medical History Form
- · Donor's Health Interview with Nurse
- · Mini Physical including; blood pressure, temperature, pulse and blood count
- · Refreshments
- · Donor will be provided with a sticker for "free parking"

• To accommodate donors, we strongly encourage that appointments be made in advance by calling the Blood Bank. The Blood Bank is open six days a week as follows:

Monday - Friday 7:45a.m. - 8pm Saturday 8:45am - 4pm
