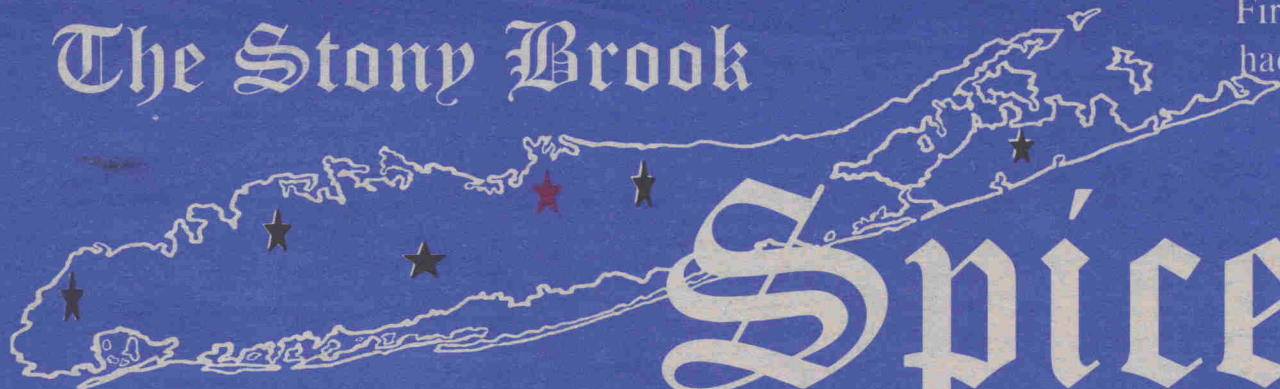

plosion has been, well, blown out of proportion. No tritium, they say, has been released into the local groundwater.

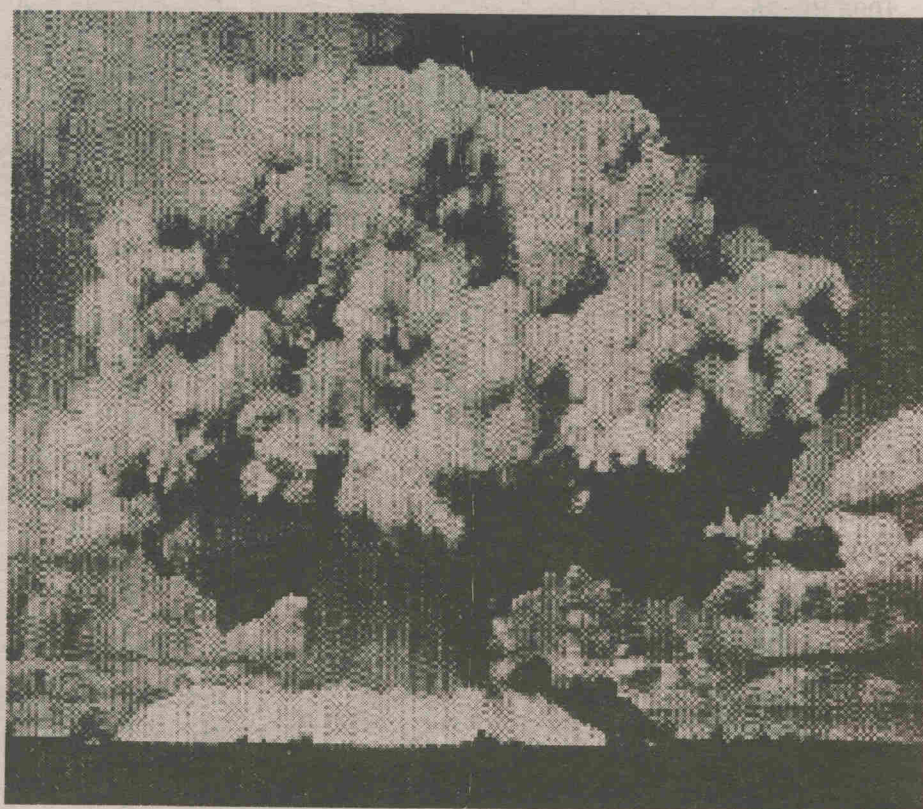
In other news, local fisherman continue to find an abundance of 3-eyed fish in their nets, and cancer has stricken 97% of Long Island residents.

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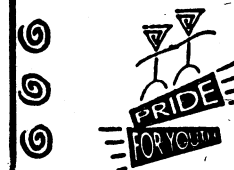
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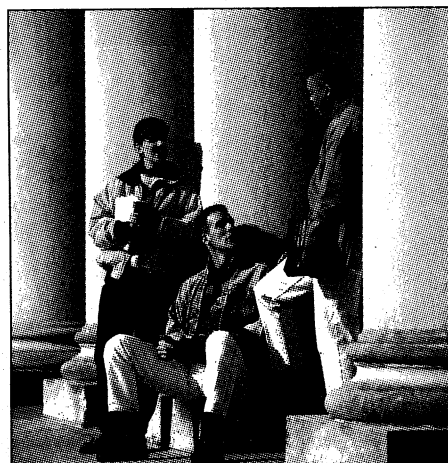
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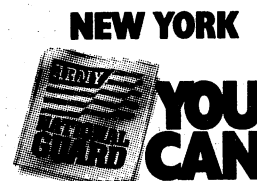


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Dear Mom,

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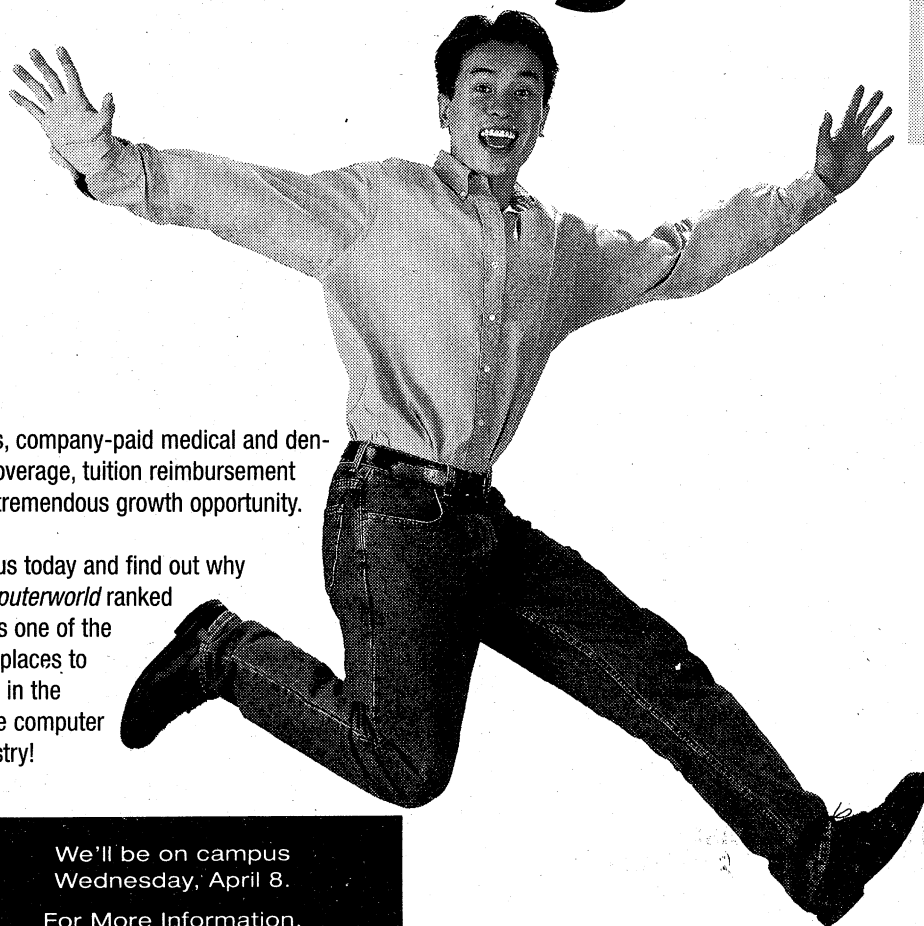

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Intramural Program Coordinator Positions

POSITION DESCRIPTIONS

General Responsibilities - All coordinators in the Intramural Program are required to share coverage of the office hours Monday thru Friday. In addition to their specific job titles and responsibilities, they are expected to be an integral part of a team committed to excellence, creativity and personal and departmental growth.

Intramural Sports Program Coordinator - (4 positions)
Intramural Sports range in format and duration depending on the activity, facility availability and participation. Team Sports offered include Flag Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Floor Hockey, Indoor and Outdoor Soccer, Softball, Beach Volleyball and Wallyball. The Intramural Sports Coordinator is involved in all aspects of planning, promoting, scheduling, hiring and training of officials, and supervising these activities.

Special Events Coordinator - (1 position) Activities such as Opening Week Activities, Homecoming Run For Scholarships, Turkey Trot, All-Night Volleyball Tournament, Basketball Tip-off, Golf Contest and Tournament, and Happy Hour Intramurals are among the activities which the Special Events Coordinator is responsible for. The Special Events Coordinator works closely with the Director in securing the sponsorship, promotion, and executing the events.


