#### Letter From: Bill Wiesner, President Elect

I would like to thank the campus community for electing me president of The Stony Brook Chapter. John Stamm and his board have done an excellent job in developing the Union on campus and publicizing its activities. # Letter From: Hanan Selvin, Elected V.P. For Academics

I hope to help the UUP to recognize that, even in this era of budgetary restraint, it is still conceivable to bring SUNY closer to the status of a genuinely outstanding state university system. Toward this end it would be desirable for the special needs and conditions of the university centers to have institutionalized recognition in Albany. Since it seems altogether unlikely that the Public Employees Relations Board (PERB) will make the university centers a separate bargaining unit, I hope that the UUP can persuade Chancellor Wharton to change the functions of the Vice-Chancellors back to what they were in the reign of Samuel Gould, in which each type of campus had its own Vice-Chancellor, who was able to keep special needs and special potentialities in mind.
