At your request, the Arts and Sciences Senate Undergraduate Curriculum Committee, following their review of the courses questioned by system administration as to their appropriateness for the SUNY American history requirement, has prepared revised SUNY course templates for all courses reviewed. The committee had solicited syllabi and any other information that might prove helpful in evaluating these courses for the SUNY American History/ Stony Brook D.E.C. Category K requirement. The information provided in the templates often includes expanded descriptions and information supplied by the instructor and includes the committee's responses to the submission.

The committee adopted a method for evaluating these courses which included review of specified learning outcomes, previously provided by SUNY, and considered whether an American history text could appropriately be required for the course. As you can see from the template forms, in many cases, American history texts were already being used and a few were added as a result of the review. As the review progressed, some instructors were invited to revise courses in order to meet the SUNY learning outcomes. When the committee believed that sufficient learning outcomes requirements could not be met, the course was moved into a more appropriate category, either D.E.C. G Humanities or D.E.C. F Social and Behavioral Sciences. In other cases the departments, after considering the SUNY learning outcomes, voluntarily removed their courses from the American History/ D.E.C. Category K requirement without submission to the committee. We have not supplied template forms for those courses and they are marked with an "\*" below.
