

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE LDS PASSPORT

This passport outlines how LDS can lead you to success at Stony Brook University. Studies show that students who are involved on campus and participate in leadership and service activities are more successful academically and are better prepared to enter the workforce and graduate professional schools. The LDS team has selected opportunities on campus that will provide you with these valuable experiences that will start you on your way to being an involved, intellectually curious, socially conscious leader.

MANDATORY ACTIVITIES: All LDS students will participate in mandatory LDS activities, and will post all LDS 101 and 102 assignments on the ePortfolio system, including the Creative Expressions Assignment, Big-Give project, Diversity Interview, and all event reflections. This is the minimum requirement for all LDS students.

RECOMMENDED PASSPORT ACTIVITIES FOR LDS ROCKSTARS: Those who have completed the mandatory LDS events (THE YEAR IN LDS) and fulfilled the recommended number of activities in 2 or more of the other categories listed on the passport will receive a general recommendation letter signed by Dr. Manuel London.

ENTERING THE PASSPORT ACTIVITIES ON THE E-PORTFOLIO SYSTEM: Students enter reflections on their experiences through their LDS passport in the form of reflections on the ePortfolio system. If you participate in the Leadstrong conference, for example, you will check off the box under "Leadership Opportunities" on your ePortfolio and link it to a reflection about the details of the conference (where, when, who) and what you learned. You may wish to embed images or video to supplement your reflection. Please follow the online guide in our LDS template for assignments or writing prompts. As with any work produced at Stony Brook University, by turning in your work, and by extension, by uploading anything to your ePortfolio, you indicate that you are faithfully representing yourself and what you have done. SIONAL! Do not include information that you do not want others to read. All ePortfolios can be viewed by the Stony Brook Community and the broader public (depending on your privacy setting). Be professional, courteous, constructive, and thoughtful in your reflections. Avoid incendiary language. Please proofread. Poor grammar and spelling is not professional and does not reflect well on you as a student. These ePortfolios may be read by an instructor or future employer.

Those who have completed the YEAR IN LDS and have satisfied the recommended number of requirements for TWO of the other categories on the passport will receive a general recommendation letter signed by Dr. Manuel London. For example, you might fulfill THE YEAR IN LDS, attend three events in the "Involvement" category, and volunteer through the Career Center. Or, you might complete THE YEAR IN LDS, become a Hall Council Member, and Volunteer for Alternative Spring Break. We encourage you to select experiences that will be meaningful to you and reflect on what you have gained from these experiences.

Those with excellent ePortfolios that thoughtfully document and reflect on what they have learned from their experiences will be entered to win prizes. To be considered, submit a link to your passport by April 15th to Leader-ship_and_Service@stonybrook.edu.
