Computing Information for Stony Brook Students - Fall 2003

CAN I HAVE AN E-MAIL ACCOUNT?

All Stony Brook students are eligible for an e-mail account. At Stony Brook, many students refer to their e-mail as their SPARKY account.

WHERE CAN I GET AN E-MAIL (SPARKY) ACCOUNT?

If you need an e-mail (SPARKY) account or are not sure if you already have one, please come to one of the following locations with your student ID card:

- Student Union, Rm 080
- Main Library SINC Site, Rm S1460
- Computing Center, Room 138 HSC Library, 3rd floor

**Once you receive an e-mail account, it is valid as long as you remain a registered student at the University.

WHY DO I NEED A STONY BROOK E-MAIL ACCOUNT?

The University communicates with students via their campus e-mail address. In addition, if you want to connect to the Internet from your dorm room or from home or via your laptop on campus, you will need to have a valid sparky account to do so.

CAN STONY BROOK E-MAIL BE FORWARDED TO ANOTHER E-MAIL ACCOUNT?

If you have an off campus e-mail address, you can forward your Stony Brook (Sparky) e-mail to any e-mail address you prefer. SOLAR (STUDENT ONLINE RECORDS)

All Stony Brook students have a SOLAR account which provides access to your academic records (This includes class schedules, graduation requirements and tuition records). HOW DO I ACCESS THE INTERNET FROM MY ROOM?

Most of the dorms have network connections while others need to dial into the network. Access to the network (both networked and analog adapters) requires that a student have an active SPARKY account.

REGISTERING COMPUTERS IN NETWORKED RESIDENCE HALLS

All Undergraduate dormitories have Ethernet connections. You MUST register your PC with the Network Operations Center in order to be able to connect to the campus network and the Internet. If there are two or more computers in your room, ALL of them must be registered. In order to connect, your machine must have an Ethernet Card and you need an RJ45 cable (This can be purchased in the Seawolves MarketPlace in the Student Activities Center). All labs have Internet access and applications such as FTP and Telnet. There are printers in all labs and some labs have scanners, CDRW's & DVD Burners. In addition, the Fine Arts lab has multimedia equipment.


