

## ITS Science Fiction Short Story Contest

- Purpose: 1) to get students to think about the impact of science and technology change on society; 2) to provide a fun way for students from multiple backgrounds and majors to relate to a focus area of ITS
- **Stories due by Mar. 1<sup>st</sup>** with winner to be announced by the end of the semester
- The rules:
  - Story must be at least **2000 words** (cannot exceed 2500 words)
  - Must be science fiction, not fantasy (No hobbits, vampires, etc. If not sure, students can ask Gary Halada at ghalada@notes.cc.sunysb.edu...)
  - Should be fiction, not an essay – in other words, it must have a plot and characters
  - Story should be based on extrapolation into the future of a scientific or technological idea or development and how it impacts people (i.e. solutions to an energy problem)
  - The descriptions of science and technology in the story do not have to be fully developed but should be thought out
  - Should take place in near to distant future (20 years from today to 20 billion years from today)
  - No plagiarism – computer tools will be used to check
- Criteria for judgment – a good story (idea, plot, and characters); quality of writing will be considered, but quality of story and originality of science and technology ideas are more important
- Prizes:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> = \$300, plus a full I-CON 27 membership (value around \$45) AND ticket to “Meet the Pros” authors/actors banquet
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> = \$200, plus a full I-CON 27 membership (value around \$45)
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> = \$100
- “Honorable mentions” will receive magazine subscriptions or something of similar value
- Prize winning story will be read on “*Destinies*”, the longest running science fiction radio show in the country!
