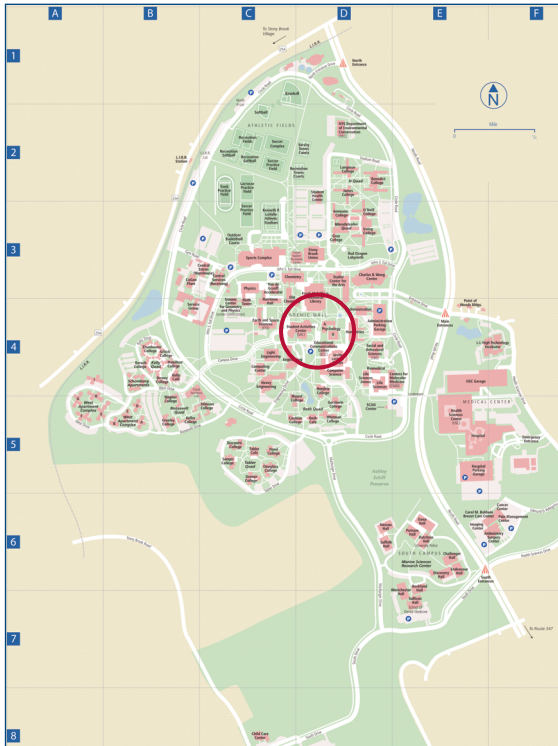


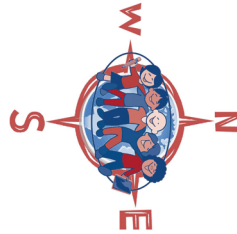
Directions

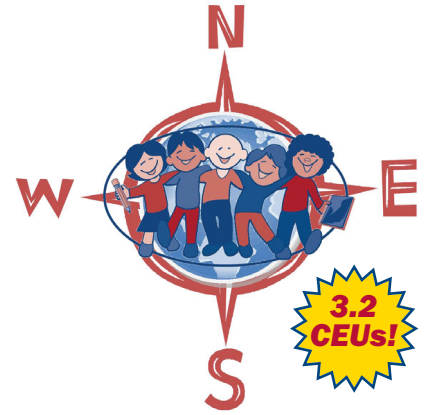

Selinza Mitchell, LVN, CNE, attended John Peter Smith Hospital School of Nursing in Fort Worth, Texas, and was licensed to practice nursing in 1982. Mitchell spent twenty-four years in clinical oncology and medical-surgical nursing, and found the passion for her practice. For the past nine years, she has been on faculty at a school of nursing in north Texas, educating nursing students on topics such as the history of healthcare nursing, critical thinking,

and law as it relates to nursing/healthcare. Through her years of making a difference, she developed a reputation as a leader and champion in problem solving as nurse liaison among licensed healthcare professionals. Entering her seventh year as a regional and national speaker, Mitchell remains a most sought after presenter, sharing her more than three decades of dedication to healthcare. Mitchell calls herself the advocates' advocate.



Thomas Preston, PhD, is a pediatric neuropsychologist in the Department of Neurology at Stony Brook. He obtained his PhD from Vanderbilt University, and completed fellowships in child clinical psychology and neuropsychology at the Yale Child Study Center and the University of Rochester. Before coming to Stony Brook, he was pediatric neuropsychologist at Children's Hospital of Western Ontario and adjunct assistant professor at the University of Western Ontario. His clinical and research interests include disorders of executive function, cognitive effects of CNS infection, head trauma, and psychosocial adjustment to illness. Dr. Preston is well known to many Suffolk County school districts for his excellent evaluations and superior, meaningful reports. A valued member of the School Intervention and Re-entry Team since 2005, Dr. Preston provides evaluations and academic plans for pediatric oncology patients coping with neurocognitive effects of cancer treatment.
