PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITY

Training the Trainers: Teaching Medical Ethics and Professionalism using OSTEs

BACKGROUND: Through a grant awarded by the Institute on Medicine as a Profession and the Josiah Macy Jr. Foundation (IMAP-Macy), Stony Brook Medicine Office of Faculty Development has developed a series of Objective Structured Teaching Exercises (OSTEs) that will be used to train and evaluate faculty on how teach professionalism and medical ethics to students in clinical settings. The OSTE format has been found to be an effective faculty development training tool for teachers to practice their teaching skills under realistic scenarios and receive immediate feedback.

WHAT: A 4-hour workshop will be offered that includes:

- eight OSTE cases in which the faculty participant will role play teaching scenarios with trained standardized students
- immediate feedback sessions with content experts along with the standardized students, and
- a debriefing and small group discussion

WHEN: This workshop will be offered three times to accommodate various faculty schedules.

Workshop 1: Thursday, October 4th, 4PM-8PM

Workshop 2: Thursday, October 25th, 1PM-5PM

Workshop 3: Monday, November 12th, 8AM-12PM

WHERE: Stony Brook University Medical Center, Health Sciences Center Level 2, Clinical Skills Center

WHO: Each workshop will accommodate up to 8 faculty participants. All faculty who teaches in the School of Medicine Third Year <u>Ambulatory Care</u> or <u>Internal Medicine</u> Clerkships are eligible to apply. This is a great learning opportunity for faculty who teach medical students and residents.

IN ADDITION: All participants

Are required to:

 Attend a 3 month follow-up meeting in which the faculty participant will propose an action plan for training other faculty/colleagues about issues related to this area (i.e., professionalism and medical ethics) in his/her department/office.

Will receive:

- An Amazon Kindle eReader upon completion of all workshop/project related requirements and evaluation measures.
- 3 continuing medical education (CME) credits.
- A Stony Brook University Hospital parking validation sticker for each on site workshop/projectrelated activity attended.
