Although the Veterans Home is experiencing less budget cuts than the worst case scenario, we are still going to be hit with a total budget cut of about 3.5 million dollars, this is about 8% of our budget. This is a larger hit than anticipated. All departments were asked to make an immediate 6% budget cut in March. We are cutting and trimming our budgets without it affecting the quality of care or quality of life that we provide.

Jonathan emphasized how vital volunteers are in supporting our mission and keeping a positive environment for the residents during these tough times. He also mentioned the need for all of us to come together.

Susan's Corner

Dear Volunteers,

As many of you know the State is facing a huge deficit. Being a New York State agency, this affects the Veterans Home. Our budget has been affected in three ways. Firstly: \$900,000 was cut by the "NY State Agency Reduction in Workforce Act", this was taken from our operating budget. Secondly, we are also affected by Medicaid cuts since 80% of our residents are on Medicaid. The Medicaid cuts equaled 1.9 million. On top of all that we are forced to increase our fringe benefits for employees from 31% to 33% per employee, this equaled \$800,000. The total cuts we are facing are about 3.5 million, this is about 8% of our budget.

Back in March each department at the Veterans Home was asked to propose a 6% cut to their operating budget to go into affect immediately. This was in anticipation of the cuts that were coming down from Albany.

The Volunteer Department did its part and proposed a 6% cut from our overall budget. In order to make this proposal I took into consideration the following: I did not want to affect the services we provide the residents or the Home. I wanted to minimize the impact on our outside partnerships with organizations such as the Red Cross or Stony Brook University. I wanted to keep intact staff hours.

To help me determine what could be cut (since we already run pretty lean), I turned to the survey I did of volunteers last year regarding our recognition program. The volunteers surprised me by rating the Holiday Party as their favorite recognition event. The June Recognition Luncheon came in second and last was the lunch we did for National Volunteer Appreciation Week.

I needed to cut \$6,000 from our budget that mostly consists of staffing. The biggest expenditure we have is our outside catering, coming in at \$8,000 a year. As a result, this is where I needed to make some cuts.

We will have two small events during National Volunteer Week, instead of the large luncheon and one small event. The Recognition Luncheon in June will be conducted in the facility. We will still be inviting those volunteers who are active and have done 50 hours in the past year (May—April). We will have a very nice event with the expertise of the Dietary department including a very nice hot luncheon, desserts, decorations and a nice program (with pins, special awards and certificates).

The Holiday Luncheon we will still have outside of the facility. However instead of a catering hall, I am looking to hold it at a Veterans Post or Firehouse. The room would have to hold about 125 people. We are looking for a volunteer who can get us this type of space for free or at a very minimal cost. Please speak to me if you can help us out with this. We will cater the event, with possibly an addition of some pot luck dishes. It will be a very nice get together for everyone, a nice way to bring in the holiday season.

I am also going to be doing a fundraising auction event at the Recognition Luncheon to raise money for the department and the Holiday Luncheon. Please see the article on page 2 for details.
