

## **GSO Senate Meeting – December 1, 2009 - Minutes**

## 1) Approved December Agenda and November Minutes

36 Department Senators in Attendance. Absent: Electrical & Computer Engineering, Music.

# 2) Deputy Provost Brent Lindquist Addresses the Senate

\$200 billion investment by the Korean Government -> Free Economic Zone. Internationalization, wants to be viewed as a gateway to Asia. Desire for a knowledge based industry. Songdo Campus – Korea will pay the faculty. 90% of Korean high school graduates attend college. (US ~33%)<sup>1</sup>. UK Times for higher Education places the top 3 Korean Universities as 50, 95, and 188 in the rankings. SBU is 127. US holds 13/20 top schools in the world. UK holds 4/20. UK has similar population to South Koreas (SK). Education is a growing global business. SK has reach out and invited American universities to set up branch campuses in the free economic zone. SONGDO Region – International University – Global Campus. NC State, Georgia Tech, Carnegie Melon, John Hopkins. SK will provide new housing for professors, all non-academic functions. Rent free for 5 years, \$1m funding. SBU provides faculty, students, and SBU degrees. Will provide study abroad programs, further bilateral exchange. SBU has very little visibility in Europe. Is well known in China, but not rest of Asia. Would like to increase global footprint. Most leading universities have a much larger international footprint. Overseas operations will be run from student's tuition in Korea, will have specific endowment. Price point is same as out-of-state tuition. Will issue grad + undergrad degrees. NYS tax dollars will NOT be spent on this work.

#### 3) GSO President Dylan Selterman Addresses the Senate

Info on MS Programs. Putting grad students on research lines. According to new plan Dean LM would not do this shifting. His primary concerns are that there would not be as many lines for recruitment. TA line allocations would be in full control by the departments as per U. Buffalo and SUNY Albany. Senator brought up the concern that departmental staff would be overworked allocating this budget. Dylan -> crucial to talk to your grad coordinator/director about this plan. According to the new plan, the grad school would control the amount of lines for first year students. The Departmental Chairperson has the decision making power. Many departments may like to reduce the number of new incoming students. There is an upcoming Town Hall Meeting on the new hotel to be built on campus, send email reminder to GSO list serve.
