

Call for Candidates - Graduate Student Organization

The Graduate Student Organization (GSO) is currently looking for candidates for the 2012-2013 Executive Council. Read about the positions below and download the nomination forms (by petition) here: http://sbgso.org/files/u1/forms/officer_elections.pdf

Nomination forms are due in the GSO Office, SAC 227, by **5:00 p.m.** on **March 23, 2012** with a candidate statement of no more than 200 words, and at least 25 supporting signatures. Candidates are expected to present their platform to the GSO Senate on April 10th at 5:30 pm. The current Executive Council will invite prospective candidates to meet the EC before the April general meeting.

President

The President of the GSO acts as the spokesperson of the GSO and works to implement its policies and positions. He or she appoints Senators and GSO members to GSO Standing Committees and other campus committees. The President is also an exofficio member of all GSO Standing Committees. This position pays \$5,550.

Vice President

The Vice President acts in the President's stead when the President is unavailable. He or she is responsible with keeping track of all GSO clubs and orgs and chairs the Social Concerns Committee, which is very involved with campus issues. This position pays \$4,500.

Treasurer

The Treasurer is responsible for the management of all GSO revenues and expenditures. He or she chairs the Budget Committee which recommends funding for all GSO sponsored events and makes the following year's budget. This position pays \$5,000.

Secretary

The Secretary records, publishes, and reports the minutes of Senate and Executive Council meetings. He or she chairs the Elections Committee and insures well publicized democratic elections. This position pays \$4,500.

In addition, all executive officials share responsibilities on different University-wide committees. Since this is a team work, prospective candidates are encouraged to run grouped under a common strategy / shared vision.
