Submission Guidelines

Please fill out the **application form**.

- Acceptance to a workshop is based primarily on the promise of your writing sample, as follows:
- **Picture Book** applicants should submit a sample or draft picture book manuscript, up to 1000 words, double-spaced, in 12-point font, with your name and page numbers on every page.
- **Illustrators** should submit 3-5 sample illustrations.
- **All others** should submit 10-20 pages of prose, double spaced, in the genre to which you're applying. The sample should be in 12-point font with your name and page numbers on every page.
- Submissions must be received by June 1, 2012. (The deadline for Early Acceptance is April 15 and Scholarship consideration is May 1st.) Please note that in certain cases beginning or advanced track determination will be at the discretion of the admissions committee. Workshop space is limited and early application is encouraged.
- Applicants are asked to submit a brief statement of purpose; please describe what you hope to accomplish during the conference.
- An application fee of \$25 must be mailed at the time of application.
- If applying for a partial scholarship, please include a letter of recommendation attesting to the strength of your work and your commitment to children's literature.
- Applicants will be notified of a decision within four weeks after receipt of application.
- Applications received after May 12 will be considered on a rolling basis if space is available.
