According to a survey done by the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force in 2003, "more than one third of gay college students experienced harassment in [2002]; half concealed sexual orientation to avoid intimidation, [and] 43% call their campus homophobic."

The Safe Space core committee has invited Eva Vega, a diversity trainer, and an expert in the area of Safe Spaces who has vast experience working with SUNY campuses, to come to Stony Brook. She will be facilitating an all day training session on June 26th for 30 people who will become trainers for the Safe Space program.

These 30 people will team up in pairs to administer at least one 3-hour Safe Space training per academic year. Our goal is to eventually train all areas of the campus.

After careful review of potential colleagues who would support this training program, the committee selected you as one of our champions for the Safe Space program. We invite you to participate in this very important initiative.

The program has been coordinated by the Center for Prevention and Outreach, The Office of Diversity and Affirmative Action, Employee Assistance Program, Physics, Psychology, Pride@SBU, and graduate and undergraduate students including some from the Stony Brook LGBT Alliance.
