For example, an OLC course on **Images of Labor in Art** takes only about an hour to complete and will offer students a quick introduction, or refresher in this key area of study just by visiting our website. And for those wishing to learn more, the NLC offers more extensive courses online, on campus and partially online for those wishing to go further.

The Open Learning Course program, when fully developed, may be the one of most exciting and innovative education ventures for the 21st century making useful knowledge instantly available to the labor community and further strengthening the labor movement in a modern, global economy.
