NYSUT & Philips Lifeline Medical Alert Service

You've probably heard about Philips Lifeline Medical Alert Service, where you summon help by pushing the

Lifeline Help button worn on a pendant or wristband. In addition to medical emergencies, the Lifeline service includes the capability to give reminders for medication, and doctors appointments, etc.

The AutoAlert option provides an added layer of protection by automatically placing a call for help if a

fall is detected when the person who fell is unable to push the button because of disorientation, immobilization or unconsciousness. This enhanced service option can provide even greater peace of mind and confidence not only to the person wearing the pendant, but also to his or her loved ones.

Another option is the Philips Medication Dispensing Service. This will alert and dispense medication to the recipient.

The unit is programmed and filled with the recipient's medication and connected to his or her phone line.

When it's the appropriate time to take the medicine, a voice-activated message will alert the recipient letting him or her know it is time to take medicine. A cup with the proper medication will dispense, and the recipient

must press a button on the PMD to record that the medicine was taken.

Likewise, the same goes for liquids and refrigerated medications. If the recipient

doesn't take the medicine,
the PMD will store the pills in a separate holding area and send a signal to Lifeline
informing what medication
the person didn't take. Lifeline will contact the caregiver on file, letting them know what
medication was missed.
