- There is an extensive list of items to bring up which may be in place.
- They will educate the folks on the east campus about what we do on the main campus.

- An invitation was extended to members of this committee collectively.
- Roy Steigbigel who is a faculty member was instrumental in this effort to get the east campus started.
- There is a need to minimize the redundancy of information conveyed from east to west.
- The Long Island States Veterans home has representation although Chapin Apartments does not which falls under a different set of rules of Residence Life. The Long Island High Tech Incubator is not included either.

5. Smoking Policy Sub-committee – Gil Hanson

- Gil and Amy came up with a proposal to Bernie Lane in reference to the smoking policy.
- The proposal was shared with the GSO.
- Amy to work with labor relations with the unions to get the 25' distance policy which the president agrees with.
- Question arose to what other SUNY campuses is smoke free. SUNY Buffalo and Albany may be the first for the State University.
- A request was made for a copy of the article from the American Lung Association for the minutes.

6. Greenhouse Gas Inventory – Amy Provenzano

- Dr. Kenny signed a commitment on September 15, 2007 for the climate commitment.
- Milestones to start with are Recycle mania, LEED, and an Endowment.
- Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) information is available online that addresses green house gas inventory. http://www.aashe.org/
- GHG inventory was created by humans. Information from 02/03 was referenced in the discussion at hand.
- PCC categories, university vehicle use, busses, cars and trucks. This does not include Suffolk county buses.
- Scope 1 inventory methodology as a power point presentation was made to the committee. A request for information was made for the minutes.
- Scope 3 of how many miles were flown by faculty, staff for university business.
- An inquiry of how much solid waste is disposed of on campus.
- Assumptions.... Solid waste, university air travel, commuting miles, faculty, students, staff and commuter students.
- Information was from Austin travel for FY 06/07 for total miles flown.
- Commuting miles from Doit to assess by Full Time, Part Time and zip codes for FY 06/07.
- Commuters average distance <75 miles away and faculty/staff <100 miles.
- Data from registrar for days per week students attend classes.
- These numbers were used for all five years.
- Pie chart of FY yr 06/07 total emissions by sector.
- Gil explained the co gen plant in 1995 was commercial.
- Main campus and east campus benefit from the cogen plant.
- Old field properties and other leased space such as Tech Park are supplied from LIPA.
- There are an estimated 320 thousand tons per year of emissions from campus
- Buffalo has an estimated 119k tons which is scope 1 & 2 which has a total students fte, 32,576, little over ten mil SF. They use Niagara Falls for energy.
- Large schools and or about the same as San Francisco average of 25 schools, 210,463.
- SBU is trending down to ~40k people which amount to approx. ten tons per person.

- Recommendations for next inventory survey to the faculty, students and staff will be prepared.
- They will also track waste streams but will not report fertilizer application.
- Other milestones for 09/10... energy task force forming a group this fall to assist with ideas and outreach.
