## Proposed text:

### **Change name to University Environment Committee**

This committee shall examine all aspects of the university environment, including but not limited to conservation of natural areas, ecological preserves and historical artifacts; transportation; parking issues; infrastructure; facilities planning; human health issues; safety and security; energy efficiency; recycling; waste management; and general appearance of all university locations. It will consult with and advise the Vice-President for Facilities and Services and the Vice President for Student Affairs.

### 1. Environmental Master Plan – Amy Provenzano

- There were great discussions, students involved, good attendance, tremendous amount of questions and follow-up.
- There will be a meeting tomorrow to discuss similar programs from west campus to compare with the east campus.
- Gil said it may be a great model for other campuses.

# 4. Campus Sustainability Task Force/Recycling – Amy Provenzano

- Amy announced there were three meetings held for the energy task force,
- It is a dynamic group comprised of three sub committees.
- They will research equipment and manufactures specifications to compare more efficient equipment energy wise over the life span.
- It was said that for instance, Sanyo in lieu of Fisher, is much more efficient in the consumption of electric.
- Question; How do you meter physics equipment consumption on electrical demand and can we really do a financial incentive?
- Gil said most departments do not have the funding for operating cost.
- Amy announced the first Newsletter was published and they are working on second edition based on a monthly schedule.
- Amy spoke about her DC trip which was fun although they were not able to meet with senators but did meet with staffers to talk about the transportation bill project.
- Hospital did not recycle their cardboard and were not able to over the past although there was a pilot program that produced 1 bale a week at half ton per bail. They performed this recycling program for one month from Jan 15 to Feb 15<sup>th</sup>. They produced one ton a day for a month.
- HSC produces one bale a week versus 2 bales a day in the hospital at an average of 7 days a week.
- The University receives 70 dollars a ton for carting, carting cost, bailing cardboard, etc
