The Frye Institute is a continuing education opportunity for individuals who are involved with, and have an interest in transforming the management of scholarly resources in higher education. Selection for participation in the institute is competitive, and begins with a nomination from a member of the institution's senior administration. In this case, Aimée was nominated by Provost Kaler.

Participants in the Frye Institute begin their experience on their home campus with discussions involving the president, provost, CFO, CIO, and dean of libraries, providing important context for their residential experience. From May 31 to June 11, participants will gather at Emory University for an intensive residential experience that exposes them to higher education leaders from around the country. These leaders will explore the following topics:

- Perspectives of executive leaders in higher education
- Public policy and government relations
- Organizational change and leadership
- Teamwork
- E-research and E-scholarship
- Scholarly communication
- Communicating and marketing the institution's messages.

The 2009 Institute is led by Chuck Henry (President, CLIR) and Diana Oblinger (President, EDUCAUSE) and is sponsored by

CLIR, EDUCAUSE, and Emory University.
