I have two large canvas recycling bins upstairs or you can contact Recycling in order to have a bin delivered to your area: http://www.stonybrook.edu/centralservices/recycling/. I've heard through the grapevine, that Harvard is averaging about 1 ton of paper a day from their libraries. We're averaging a few pounds! *OK*, *I made that one up*. In Main Circ., we've recycled old documents, copies of articles and reprints, bills, and card applications; handouts that had misinformation; date due cards that are no longer used; Gift Books that couldn't be sold, etc. So, look through some of your old file cabinets and start recycling paperwork that is no longer needed.
