Consistency in Legislation Act

The purpose of this legislation is to repeal the "CORE Laws," and to eliminate inconsistencies between the "CORE Laws" and "The 2nd Clubs and Organizations Bill of Rights," and to ensure that there is but one set of criteria for all clubs and organizations to receive funding from the Undergraduate Student Government that is viewpoint neutral.

Article I Title

The title of this bill shall be the "Consistency in Legislation Act."

Article II CORE Laws Repealed

The bill heretofore known under the Undergraduate Student Government Senate legislation as the "CORE Laws" is hereby repealed.

Article III Fair Standards Enactment

"The Second Clubs and Organizations Bill of Rights" shall supersede existing laws previously enacted by the Undergraduate Student Government Senate related to standards for receiving and maintaining funds through the Student Activity Fee.

Article IV Authorization for the Enforcement of Articles I Through IV of this Bill

Section 1 The Executive Council is authorized to enforce Articles I through IV of this bill, including the adoption and execution of policies and procedures made pursuant to it.

Section 2 Articles I through IV of this of this bill are law, having full force and binding.

Article V Support for the Enforcement of Articles I Through IV of this Bill, Including the Adoption of Policies and Procedures to Enact and Enforce "The Second Clubs and Organizations Bill of Rights"

Section 1 The Senate of the Undergraduate Student Government supports the efforts of the Executive Council to –

i. enforce "The Second Clubs and Organizations Bill of Rights."

ii. no longer enforce standards for receiving and maintaining funds through the Student Activity Fee in enacted legislation made by the Undergraduate Student Government previous to "The Second Clubs and Organizations Bill of Rights."

Section 2 This Article is an expression of the will of the Senate, and shall not be construed as binding the Executive Council to any action.
