

At year 30, Stony Brook continues to move aggressively toward national prominence as a full-service research university. With strong support from our friends, we are entering our fourth decade with unprecedented growth in philanthropic contributions. I extend my thanks to all those who have made this year's Annual Fund a success, and pledge my commitment to the high goals you are helping us achieve.

Stony Brook's Annual Fund has grown from \$32,700 in 1984 to \$157,000 in the current year, an increase of 480% in four years. Meet Ann C. Begam, the new director of alumni affairs at the University at Stony Brook. Ann arrived on campus with the start of the new semester in September and brings to our campus lots of experience and enthusiam. In welcoming Begam to the campus Denise Coleman, assistant vice president for alumni affairs and development, said, "I am very optimistic that Ann will strengthen the framework established by her predecessor, Andrea Young. Ann has a strong programming and organizational background and will be a great asset to the current staff. We look forward to enhancing ongoing communications between the university and its graduates."

Begam, who came to Stony
Brook from SUNY at Albany

have a young alumni body." A
graduate of Roosevelt University,
Begam hopes to strengthen the
Student Alumni Council's (SAC)
impact on the campus, begin career
tracking for seniors, fortify the
regional alumni associations, and
invigorate reunions.

Prior to her appointment at SUNY Albany, Begam, a native of New York City, was manager of special programs at Michael Reese Hospital and Medical Center in Chicago, where she handled development and special program projects, coordinated the hospital's centennial, and planned other public affairs programs and special events, and was Executive Director of the Physician's Alumni Association.

# A Day of Football, Reunions, and Celebration

Amidst sunny skies and multi-colored balloons, nearly 1,500 students, faculty, alumni, and staff cheered the Stony Brook Patriots on October 17 as the university continued to build a Homecoming tradition with a winning football game and king and queen.

At the annual homecoming game, the Patriots trounced Brooklyn College 48-12. Highlights included four touchdowns scored in the first half by senior Chuck Downey. Downey also had punt-return touchdowns of 60 and 62 yards, which brought his career total of punt returns to seven, and ties the all-time NCAA record. Paul Klyap, a junior, had two interceptions, while senior Mike Licata had 12 carries, for a total of 143 yards.

At half-time, outgoing royalty Bill Nelson and queen Hilary Garskof crowned their succesors Howard Gale and Fran Wexler. But that wasn't all that was going on. In the Stony Brook Union a crafts fair and bake sale also attracted crowds. Children flocked around a face-painting booth and the make-your-own-button table while their parents plunked down money to support Stony Brook's day care.

Homecoming Weekend, a tradition since 1984, has become a popular weekend event in October. Giving faculty and staff a chance to get out and meet the students, it also shows visiting prospective students that Stony Brook does have a weekend life. Highlighting the event is the crowning of the new king and queen, which is no mere popularity contest.

Each year's contestants undergo a rigorous judging process. Chosen by a panel of class representatives, alumni, faculty, staff, and last year's Homecoming king and queen, you have to be more than just a pretty face.

Before the contestants get to that panel, they have to be nominated by the dorm they live in or by Commuter College.

These nominations are based on the students' involvement and visibility, as well as dedication to a cause.

They've written their statements, prepared their speeches, and now they wait. Once before the panel, the candidates give a

three- to five-minute speech, and then answer questions put to them by the panel. They are judged on poise, the content and delivery of their speech, their spontaneous response to questions, and their involvement in student activities. Each panel member scores the contestants. Then the scores are added up for the highest total. And that is only the beginning.

Being Homecoming king or queen isn't all fun and games. There are duties required that involve more than simply smiling for the crowd. The king and queen represent the student body, help voice student needs, and participate in phonathons, Family Day, convocations, and the Student Alumni Chapter (SAC).

But none of this is new to Howard Gale, a senior and this year's king. In applying to podiatry school, he's spent much of his time in interviews. He is already vice president of SAC and has helped coordinate the oozeball tournament (volleyball in the mud) and "Senior Sendoff." He was vice president of Whitman College legislature and a student representative on the Babak Movahedi Student Leadership Award Committee.

Fran Wexler, a senior from Kelly C and this year's queen, is also no stranger to hard work. She has been involved with the Student Activities Board (SAB), Polity, G-Fest, and Fall Fest. This past summer she attended the National Association of Campus Activities in Nashville, and after graduation plans to work for a public relations firm in New York City. As queen she will also take an active role in SAC.

Where will all this Homecoming activity lead? Ann Begam, Stony Brook's new alumni director, hopes that it will bring a closer involvement between students, alumni, and faculty. "I hope the faculty can help us identify alumni who want to become involved," said Begam. She added that she also hopes to find students with leadership abilities who are willing to work toward helping the university and developing better relations with the campus community. No promises yet, but there are plans for an even bigger '88 homecoming and '68/78 class reunions!









# University Alliance Membership Climbs

Donors who make gifts of \$100 or more to the Annual Fund are recognized in the University Alliance. Membership in the four giving clubs of the Alliance has climbed from 152 in 85-86 to 212 members in 86-87. Together members contributed \$356,000\* to the university this year. Membership in the President's Circle recognizes annual contributions of \$5,000 or more. Lifetime membership is given for an endowed gift of at least \$50,000. Stony Brook Associate members contribute \$1,000-\$4,999, Stony Brook Forum \$500-\$999, and Century Club members \$100-\$499.

Members of the Alliance receive a newsletter (the University Alliance Report), a certificate of appreciation, and a lapel pin with Stony Brook's seal. Alliance members are also invited to the campus for special events throughout the year. Some of the events members participated in last year included the following:

- A black-tie thank-you dinner was held in May in the Fine Arts Center Gallery for contributors of \$1,000 or more to any university program this year. The dinner was followed by a cabaret performance in Theatre One.
- President's Circle members were entertained by President and Mrs. Marburger at their home.
- The first piano recital given at Carnegie Hall after it reopened was by Stony Brook doctoral candidate Arthur Greene. After the concert, alumni members of the Alliance were invited

to congratulate the artist at a reception hosted in the Hall by Mr. and Mrs. Leonard A. Spivak '64.

- Alliance members received special invitations to the Distinguished Lecture Series and the Authors and Editors reception and were invited to a tour of the linear accelerator and a back-stage tour of the Fine Arts Center. Members have also been given private tours of University Hospital to see the life-saving work being done there.
- The spring opening of the Poetry Center was attended by several members of the Alliance. Pulitzer Prize-winning poet Louis Simpson, a professor at Stony Brook, read from his new works. A reception followed

the reading hosted by the Stony Brook Foundation and Pindar Vineyards.

- Alumni and faculty/staff Alliance members were guests of President and Mrs. Marburger at a special reception in the Javits room in the library on Homecoming Day. Parent members were guests at a similar reception on Family Day.
- \*Certain restricted contributions of Alliance members are not included as part of the Annual Fund total.



# Annual Fund Tops \$150,000

State University of New York at Stony Brook received \$157,367 in contributions to the Annual Fund in 1986-87. The Fund's fiscal year is from July 1 to June 30. Now in its fourth year, the Annual Fund receives support from alumni, faculty/staff, parents, and corporate and community friends. Also included in the fund total are corporate matching gifts. Eighteen hundred seventy contributors are listed in this year's roster of donors. We thank all our contributors for their loyalty and support.

Who gives to the Annual Fund?

Alumni contributed \$66,103, faculty and staff, \$13,971, parents, \$3,928, corporate and community friends, \$65,320, and matched giving companies, \$8,165. The class with the largest number of donors was '81, followed by '74 and '80. The class with the greatest percentage of donors was '63. Tied for

the largest number of donors over \$50 were '71 and '78. The class that contributed the most money (\$4,559) was '82. Teachers, business managers, engineers, and lawyers are our most frequent contributors, and donors come from 36 different states.

How does Stony Brook compare with other SUNY schools?

Stony Brook is ranked fifth by alumni on record and 20th of 50 SUNY campuses in alumni gifts. It is 12th by number of alumni donors. Keeping in mind that Stony Brook's Annual Fund is only four years old, we are doing quite well in comparison with other schools that have had an armual giving program for many more years. But since we believe Stony Brook is the best campus in the system, our hope is that we will one day be number one in showing alumni loyalty and support.

University Hospital has joined Rotary International's Gift of Life program, which provides free treatment for children from abroad who have heart problems.

The Gift of Life is an international cooperative health care program that helps children with cardiac problems who cannot receive advanced forms of treatment in their homelands. Physicians and other health professionals donate their services while the host Rotary organization in the United States underwrites the costs of the hospital stay.

Gift of Life patients coming to University Hospital will receive special treatment in other ways as well. The Association for Community University Cooperation (ACUC), a community support group for the campus, will help find host families who will take in the children while they recuperate in this country. International students attending the university will serve as "volunteer friends," visiting children from the same country.

The Gift of Life program draws support from Rotary Clubs in 20 countries on four continents.

### Growing Support for University Hospital Burn Center

Several "media events" concerning the Burn Center at University Hospital have resulted in growing support for the Burn Center's work.

In the fall of 1986, the *Three Village Herald* ran a feature article about the Burn Center in conjunction with a benefit subscription drive. With each new subscription, the *Herald* donated one dollar to the Volunteer Firefighters Burn Center Fund, for a total of \$2,000. The gift was augmented by a personal donation of \$5,000 from the *Herald's* publisher, Gardner "Pat" Cowles III.

The Viacom and Cablevision channels will air a 30-minute documentary about the Burn Center this fall. The documentary was funded in part by WBLI radio, which also gave support to the Burn Center Fund by promoting the Marathon Jiffy Lube held at the Jiffy Lube in St. James. Jiffy Lube Corporation donated a percentage of the marathon's income to the Fund. The day of the marathon, August 15, was also the date of the Burn Center's benefit, "Fifties Jubilee,"

held at Bald Hill. The Town of Brookhaven, McNamara Buick-Pontiac in Port Jefferson, and the North Fork Bank co-sponsored the benefit. All in all, a big day for the Burn Center Fund!

The final media events was the debut in April of *Broadside*, the Volunteer Firefighters Burn Center Fund newsletter. This poster-sized publication was distributed to 110 fire departments and all EMS units in Suffolk County.

Interest in the Burn Center and the volunteer firefighters has spread beyond county boundaries. In the spring, the New York State Assembly awarded a special legislative allocation of \$5,000 to SUNY Stony Brook. This allocation, which was proposed by 4th District Assemblyman Robert Gaffney, provided seed money for a pulmonary function screening program at University Hospital. The program is offered at no charge to Suffolk County firefighters and detects changes in normal lung function over a period of time.

#### Creating a Named Scholarship

A named scholarship is a lasting tribute that can be made in honor or in memory of anyone associated with Stony Brook.

Scholarships have been created in the name of alumni, parents of alumni, faculty, and friends who have supported the university or who have been cared for at University Hospital.

Scholarships are vital to all institutions of higher education. They can extend an opportunity to students who could not otherwise afford a college education, they can inspire achievement by rewarding superior accomplishments, and they can attract the best of scholars to Stony Brook's student body.

A named scholarship can be established in an area of special interest. For instance, scholarships have been established for music, nursing, engineering, marine sciences, dentistry, earth and space sciences, and many other areas.

When you create a named scholarship you can specify the criteria for the award as long as it's in keeping with university policy. Selection is made by the university within designated criteria. Scholarships are currently awarded for academic excellence, student leadership, and community service. There are also scholarships for minority students, returning students, and handicapped students.


An endowed scholarship is the most lasting scholarship you can establish. It allows a yearly award to be made in perpetuity from only the interest generated in that account. The minimum amount necessary to endow a scholarship is \$2,000. An endowment gift can be a one-time gift or can be pledged over several years.

To establish a named scholarship that is not endowed, the amount of the award must be contributed yearly.


#### PHILANTHROPY
